Loving Mother of the Redeemer, who remains the accessible Gateway of Heaven, and Star of the Sea, Give aid to a falling people that strives to rise; O Thou who begot thy holy Creator, while all nature marveled, Virgin before and after receiving that "Ave" from the mouth of Gabriel, have mercy on sinners. During the season of Advent, priests and religious throughout the world, daily recite this Marian antiphon, Alma Redemptoris Mater. In this prayer and devotion, we call to mind the great role played by the Blessed Virgin Mary in salvation

history, and we look to her with the eyes of children upon their mother.

Like Lent, though on a smaller scale, the church asks us to take on a spirit of penance and anticipation. As the holiday season comes into full swing, we must

challenge ourselves to see the spiritual dynamics of preparation for the great feast of Christmas. We are called to exercise penance, prayer, and alms giving in a way that makes our hearts ready to welcome Christ into the world as our Savior. While many celebrate without any real thought of Christ, we must challenge ourselves not to lose sight of the real meaning of what we do. May we enter into a deeper time of prayer, sacrifice, and generosity so that when Christ comes, we're not celebrating simply a social nicety, but truly that Christ has humbled Himself so that we might have Salvation. Like the Blessed Virgin Mary, then, may we keep on ours on Christ in prayerful watching and anticipation until the joyous day of His birth and the majestic celebration of the Epiphany.
