




## STAINED GLASS WINDOW REFLECTION: ST. CATHERINE OF SIENA BY FR. HENRY O. HOFFMANN, C.O.

On the rear wall of the Oratory chapel, facing the street, a stained glass window depicts St. Catherine of Siena comforting the family of a deceased victim of the bubonic plague. St. Catherine is famous for her courage during the bubonic plague; at one point, she even mustered the courage to drink a bowl full of the blood and pus from the wounds of one of her patients. The next day, the Lord gave her a vision in which she drank mystically from His pierced side. This vignette illustrates the spiritual power of self-discipline and self-denial; a power that St. Catherine yielded far beyond the bounds of her convent and her native city. She convinced the Pope to return to Rome, thus ending the Avignon papacy. She was renowned for her prudence and political sagacity during her lifetime, and has since been declared a patroness of Europe. Her book The Dialogue contains the highest mystical wisdom. Her presence in the chapel reminds us, as she said, "Be who God wants you to be, and you will set the world on fire." May our hearts burn with the same intensity as hers, and may we do good as she did.
