On March 12, we celebrated the 400<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Canonization of St. Philip Neri, alongside St. Ignatius of Loyola, St. Francis Xavier, St. Isidore the Farmer, and St. Teresa of Avila. To celebrate this event, we will be hosting a jubilee celebration on April 21. You can find more information about the event on the last page.

A local foundation is helping to cover about half of the costs to allow us also to celebrate the 27 catechumens and confirmation candidates we will be welcoming into the Church or confirming at the Easter Vigil. The foundation has also given us a \$25,000 matching gift, which I am announcing to you with this newsletter and will speak more about at the celebration in April. The veils of Passiontide!

"Hear me, O Lord, for thy mercy is kind; look upon me according to the multitude of thy tender mercies, O Lord." In the blessing of ashes on Ash Wednesday, these are the first words heard by the faithful. These words set the entire stage for the penitential days ahead in preparing for the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of our Savior. In these words, the Lenten spirit is captured as they reveal an acknowledgment of sin and infidelity, a hope and confidence in the mercy of God, and a conversion of heart that is permanent, unselfish, and burning with charity. The image of the Sacred Heart of our Lord reveals to us the Divine sentiments of the Heart of God. From it, we derive the strength to suffer well; to love, in this world, means to suffer. May our Hearts burn with the strength and fire of His Love.
