

NOTE from the PASTOR



Today, on this First Sunday of April, we begin what is known as Passiontide. In the Gospel, we hear how Christ hid Himself close to His betrayal and Passion. To make this real for us, so many centuries away from Christ, the Church veils the statues in our churches from

us. Giving us the absence of the beauty of our saints, our churches, and filling us with a sense of emptiness and sadness. During these final two weeks before Easter, Lent takes on a new approach. Rather than calling to mind our sinfulness and nothingness, we now focus more intently on the Passion. Christ suffered because of our sins. Hopefully, having become more aware of our faults and sinfulness these past few weeks, we now see the result of those failings.

Over these next few weeks, focus on the great mercy the Lord has shown to us by His Passion and Death. Resolve, as St. Alphonsus Liguori tells us in his Stations of the Cross, never to offend the Lord again by our sins. On Easter Sunday, the Lord rose from the dead to conquer death and to offer life to each of us. But we can only receive this life if we are willing to change our lives and give ourselves entirely to Christ. May never look back at the old man, but only look forward to Heaven, where our true citizenship is, as St. Philip Neri so often reminds us.

Please be sure to take advantage of the Holy Week Masses and Liturgies. They are like last year but are still foreign to us and different. Review my old bulletin columns from last year as a

refresher. Holy Week books available to those who wish them for \$20. These have commentary on the rites to explain them while also having the full rituals in an easy-to-use format. You can purchase these before Holy Week to look these over in advance so that you can more prayerfully enter into Holy Week.

Please also be sure to remember our Catechumens, those up for reception into the Church, and those who will receive Confirmation at the Easter Vigil. Please also remember all of our First Communicants in your prayers, who will receive Communion for the first time the two weeks after Easter. Thank you to all those who assisted them in any way by either teaching them or serving as a sponsor!

Lastly, be sure to support our Ravioli Dinner at Sacred Heart on Palm Sunday. This time it will **ONLY** be frozen ravioli, sauce, and meatball. We will not have the full dinner this time, but please pray we can restart that this Fall. Thank you to everyone who has assisted with this thus far and who will assist us in the weeks to come. Find more details later in this newsletter. I also want to thank all those who helped in any way with the Old St. Mary's Fish Fry, especially the organizers. We made about \$10,000 on just this one night, our best fish fry ever. So thank you! Have a blessed month ahead!

First Friday and First Saturday

Good Friday Fast and Abstinence

Good Friday is an obligatory day of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, all Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but not to equal a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence, that is not eating meat, are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

Palm Sunday Mass Times

Please note that Masses on Palm Sunday at Old St. Mary's will be at 7:15 a.m. (Low Latin) & **8:45 a.m. (Sung Latin)**. There will be **no confessions between the Low and Sung Mass**. German Mass will still begin at 11:30 a.m. and English Mass at 1:00 p.m. This is only for Palm Sunday; Easter Sunday is normal Sunday Mass schedule. The schedule will be very tight on Palm Sunday, thank you for your understanding!

Holy Week

Please note the following Holy Week schedule: The Triduum will be held at Old St. Mary's. Holy Thursday Sung Mass will begin at 6:30 p.m. followed by watching at the Altar



until Midnight. On Good Friday, the Mass of the pre-sanctified will begin at 12:00 noon. Confession will be heard from 9:00 a.m. until 11:00 a.m. Stations of the Cross will be at 11:00 a.m. On Holy Saturday, the Easter Vigil will begin at 2:00 p.m. Please remember that the Easter Vigil lasts between 4 and 5 hours. Please note that we are following the Traditional Holy Week this year, in effect before 1955. The times for these Masses and Liturgies are reflective of the rubrics of the time.

PLEASE NOTE: There will be no Sunday Vespers on April 10, 17, 24, and May 1, and no Tuesday Evening Adoration or Confession on April 12, 19

Tenebrae

Join us for Tenebrae on Holy Wednesday and Holy Thursday at Sacred Heart. **Tenebrae will be at 6:30 p.m. on Holy Wednesday and at 9:00 p.m. on Holy Thursday. Join us for Tenebrae at Old St. Mary's at 6:30 p.m. on Good Friday.** These are about two-hour chanted services.

Blessing of Easter Baskets

Easter Baskets will be blessed on Holy Saturday (April 3) and following the Easter Vigil around 7:00 p.m. (give or take). See the flyer found in Church for information on how to put together a basket, but any Easter Food will do!

PLEASE NOTE: The parish office will be closed on April 15 and 18.

Mercy Sunday

Confessions will be heard on Divine Mercy Sunday (April 24) from 2:00 p.m. until 3:00 p.m. Devotions to the Divine Mercy will be recited at 3:00 p.m. Please join us on this day that the Church grants a Plenary Indulgence to all who participate in the devotions. The Lord also has promised the renewal of the soul to baptismal purity for all who confess and receive Communion on this day and place their trust in His Divine Mercy.

Our brothers and sisters in the womb


By our prayers, our words,

Please ensure that anything you want to place out in church has been pre-approved by Fr. Jon-Paul. Anything set out without his approval will be removed. Things placed out do not mean Fr. Jon-Paul or the other Fathers necessarily agree with material or promote it, only that there is nothing contrary to the teachings of the Church.

CONFESSIONS: Please remember that Confession times before 9:00 a.m. daily Mass at Sacred Heart and before Old St. Mary's 12:10 Mass are often not full. Saturday mornings are usually less crowded with two priests generally hearing confessions at that time. If you are able to make it to a less busy time, please do so for those who can't. Please always try to be concise, clear, and well prepared, especially when the confession line is long. If you need spiritual advice on any matter that requires more than a few minutes, please make a separate appointment—we're happy to be of service. Thank you for your consideration and cooperation so that we may make the Sacrament of Penance available to as many people as possible.



As the pre-55 Holy Week continues to be rediscovered and brought to more churches, and as the pre-55 Pentecost Vigil is likewise reclaimed, clergy and laity have been hoping to find adequate resources to help the laity follow along with the ceremonies, particularly in light of the fact that most of the daily missals in print feature the "restored" Holy Week of 1955/1962. It is true that a few of the daily missals in print contain all of these texts (such as the Fr. Lasance and the St. Andrew's), but not everyone has a copy of these missals, and they are bulky and pricey. Other attempts in recent years at making booklets for the Triduum have been acceptable as temporary steps but not yet at the level of readability, aesthetics, and user-friendliness we would hope for.

All of the rich ceremonies of Palm Sunday and of the Triduum are laid out in full, with the Latin texts and English translation, and a handsome use of red and black lettering. The periodic rubrical and exegetical notes are an especially thoughtful addition and would make this a superb resource for all who wish to meditate beforehand or afterwards on the profound meaning of the ceremonies.

Altogether, *Hebdomada Sancta* is the most complete, handy, and beautiful congregational aid for the pre-55 ceremonies that has yet been published, and it is likely to be the gold standard for quite some time to come.


