CHRISTMAS SERMON of ST. LEO THE GREAT



Dearly beloved, today our Savior is born; let us rejoice. Sadness should have no place on the birthday of life. The fear of death has been swallowed up; life brings us joy with the promise of eternal happiness.

No one is shut out from this joy; all share the same reason for rejoicing. Our Lord, victor over sin and death, finding no man free from sin, came to free us all. Let the saint rejoice as he sees the palm of victory at hand. Let the sinner be glad as he receives the offer of forgiveness. Let the pagan take courage as he is summoned to life.

In the fullness of time, chosen in the unfathomable depths of God's wisdom, the Son of God took for himself our common humanity in order to reconcile it with its creator. He came to overthrow the devil, the origin of death, in that very nature by which he had overthrown mankind.

And so at the birth of our Lord the angels sing in joy: Glory to God in the highest, and they proclaim peace to men of good will as they see the heavenly Jerusalem being built from all the nations of the world. When the angels on high are so exultant at this marvelous work of God's goodness, what joy should it not bring to the lowly hearts of men?

Through the sacrament of baptism you have become a temple of the Holy Spirit. Do not drive away so great a guest by evil conduct and become again a slave to the devil, for your liberty was bought by the blood of Christ.

There will be carols at 11:30 p.m. before the Midnight Mass. Procession to the crib will begin at 11:50 p.m. Masses at Sacred Heart on Monday, December 25 will be at 9:00 a.m. (English) and 11:00 a.m. (Sung Latin).

New Year's Day Mass Schedule

Masses at Old St. Mary on Monday, January 1, will be at 9:00 a.m. (Latin) and 11:00 a.m. (English) (please note - you may have recieved an Oratory newsletter with incorrect Mass times for New Year's Day). You may begin to pick up the jugs of water on January 6. Blessed chalk will be available on January 6.
