## NOTE *from the* PASTOR



The month of January opens for us beneath the bright, yet gentle light of the Epiphany. After the quiet of Bethlehem and the hidden years of Nazareth, the Church now lifts her voice to proclaim that the Child born of the Virgin is not for Israel alone, but for all nations. The Magi, guided by the star, represent the long pilgrimage of the Gentile world toward

Christ. They arrive not by accident, but by providence, for God Himself draws the searching heart to His Son.

The Epiphany reminds us that Christ is revealed as King, God, and Sacrifice. Gold confesses His kingship, frankincense His divinity, and myrrh foreshadows His saving death. The Wise Men kneel, not merely before a lovable Child, but before the Eternal Word made flesh. Their worship teaches us that true wisdom ends on one's knees. In an age so confident in knowledge yet often forgetful of God, the Epiphany calls us back to humble adoration.

For this reason, I invite you to join us for our High Mass of the Epiphany on Tuesday, January 6, at 6:30 p.m. at Old St. Mary's. The solemnity of the liturgy, the beauty of sacred music, and the ceremonial richness of the Church's prayer all serve the same purpose: to manifest Christ to us, just as He

was manifested to the Magi. We will also hear from the Solemn Proclamation of the date of Easter during this Mass. In the Sacred Liturgy, the same Lord whom they adored is truly present upon the altar, offering Himself for our salvation. To attend this Mass is to stand mystically beside the Magi and to offer Christ not gold, frankincense, or myrrh, but our hearts.

January also brings before us the great figure of St. Francis de Sales, whose feast we celebrate on January 24 and 29. He is the primary patron of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati and a secondary patron of the Cincinnati Oratory, and rightly so. Known for his gentleness, patience, and deep charity, St. Francis reminds us that holiness is not reserved for a few heroic souls but is possible in every state of life. His teaching that we should "be who you are and be that well" harmonizes beautifully with the mystery of the Epiphany: each of us is called to reflect the light of Christ in the particular circumstances God has given us.

As we begin this new year, may the star of the Epiphany guide our parishes ever more surely to Christ, and may St. Francis de Sales intercede for us, that our faith be marked by truth spoken in charity.

## St. Blaise Blessing of Throats

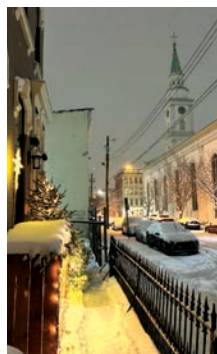

## Parking

This is a reminder that we need to be considerate and charitable when it comes to parking for Mass. We have grown lax and uncharitable when it comes to parking. While we have been tolerating double parking in the big Old St. Mary's lot, double parking is NOT to take place in any other parking lot. If we continue to see this, we will begin to tow. Please also do not take any spot that otherwise has a reserved parking sign on it or a parking cone in it. These spots are reserved for specific people. Unless you are that specific person, the spot is not being saved for you. If you block someone in, in ONLY the main Old St. Mary's lot, you should be the first person out to start letting people out. Parking in the Salvation Army lots is only allowed on Sundays and certain evening Masses when James is present to ensure you have a parking pass. Please do not just park there outside of Sunday or when it isn't clear you can park there. We do not own those lots. Remember on Sunday until 2 p.m. and major holidays like Christmas and New Year's, you can park in metered spaces for free.



## Weather Cancellations

Please keep an eye on both the web page and our social media pages for any cancellations. As a general rule, if there is at least a Level 2 snow emergency, non-Obligation Masses (Masses other than Sunday or Holy Days) at Sacred Heart, and all other events at either parish will be cancelled. We will continue to have

Mass at Old St. Mary, but use your prudent judgement. We will try to diligently keep the webpage and social media updated when bad weather arrives. If the weather looks frightful, please be sure to check before leaving home.

## Musical Notes

Although the holiday of secular Christmas ended promptly at midnight on December 25, we are just getting started with the real thing. Daily morning Masses in the Christmas octave will feature singing by the Carmelite Daughters, and the churches will continue to echo this great feast and the arguably even greater Feast of Epiphany, at least historically speaking, until we finally completely leave Christmas' last vestiges on Candlemas, February.



Although January can be something of a slow month in music, mark your calendars for Wednesday, January 14 at 7 p.m.! That day, in the Sacred Heart Auditorium, the Oratory Singers will present a unique concert program highlighting the relationship between sacred art and music on behalf of the Anerio Institute, and the winner of our Sacred Art Essay Contest will be announced! Thanks to all who participated!

We are incredibly proud of the progress that the children of the Laudate Pueri Schola Cantorum and the St. Philip Neri Choristers have been making this season. In addition to a greatly expanded role within Advent Oratory, the Choristers have sung for Midnight Mass, Sunday Vespers, and the trebles now sing for first Friday Masses, propers, and ordinary, and motets, on their own. About twice a month, you will hear the choristers augmenting the choir on Sunday at the High Mass, and from my place at the stand, it is a thrilling experience to conduct polyphony with the eager voices of children carrying the top line.

You might want to start thinking about whether you want to have your children take part in this incredible program next year. If you have any inquiries, reach out and let me know — I am happy to help! Students receive practical vocal instruction from professionals, and gain practical experience singing for the sacred liturgy at an extremely high level alongside seasoned professional and auditioned volunteer vocalists. It is an irreplaceable opportunity.

Finally, as we leave the Christmas season with its familiar carols, a word of encouragement to keep singing in the pews, even through the seasons when the hymns aren't such fixtures of childhood.

Singing the Ordinary, the hymns, the responses, is a significant part of what makes our community so special. It is also a tremendous example to the young, and taking part of these responses and singing from a young age, even just in the pews, is one of the, most important ways to get and keep people singing, and to keep the music alive in a vital way, and not just as the preserve of a few experts.
