NOTE from the PASTOR



As we prepare to begin Lent this upcoming Wednesday, March 2, may we prepare ourselves to enter this holy season with humility and temperance. Please remember that Ash Wednesday is a day of Fast and Abstinence. *Please see page 5 for the norms.*

In addition to preparing ourselves to participate in the passion of Christ and celebrate His resurrection on Easter Sunday, the Church, in her wisdom, gives us this season because we grow too comfortable with the world at times. We grow too comfortable with ourselves and the mediocrity we find ourselves. This is very harmful to us spiritually because ultimately, as St. Philip Neri reminds us, our citizenship is in Heaven.

So we enter into this holy season with a sense of humility and temperance because we must learn and teach ourselves to live not for and in the world but to live for and with God. This is why our fasting and penances are so necessary. It is a preparation for eternity.

Most of the things we have in the world we simply don't need. They are certainly convenient, they make life easier, they are enjoyable, but do we truly need them? Especially the things we become so attached to. The dangers in our material world, especially with our possessions, are very real. We begin to

determine human value and worth based upon belongings. Our worth to the corporate world is based on what and how much we buy from them. Our worth to the government is based on how much we pay taxes. However, we are much more than that, and Christ purchased us at a great price. His own blood!

So strive this Lent, as I remind you every year, not to just give up superficial things for Lent. While I don't dispute the value of those penances either, I simply encourage everyone also to give up something meaningful, challenging, something that you make hurt a bit. Look also for a particular vice you may have, and seek to give up the corresponding sin and grow in the opposite virtue. Ensure you pray more often, get to daily Mass regularly, and do some spiritual reading. And certainly seek to care for those less fortunate than ourselves, those impoverished materially, physically, mentally, spiritually. This will fulfill the command of the Lord, to pray, to fast, and to give alms.

We may stumble a bit this Lent but pick back up strong if you do, and don't think that Lent was for nothing. The Lord is ever patient with us, and if we are willing to keep trying, God will send us His help. I pray we all have a fruitful Lent, grow in virtue, and carry the cross with the Lord. 

Please remember that this is not a holy day of obligation, but it is a day of fasting and abstinence. Masses at Old St. Mary will be at 7:15 a.m. (Low Latin), 12:10 p.m. (English) and 6:30 p.m (Sung Latin). Mass at Sacred Heart will be at 9:00 a.m. (Low Latin). Please join us for Mass to begin the Lenten season.

Ash Wednesday and Lenten Fast and Abstinence

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, all Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but not to equal a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence, that is not eating meat, are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.


Priests for Life, along with many other pro-life groups, urges believers to celebrate this day as a **Day of the Unborn Child**, with special observances that highlight the Church's pro-life teachings.

The Magisterium's most comprehensive statement on the sanctity of life, the encyclical *Evangelium Vitae*, was issued on March 25, 1995, the Solemnity of the Annunciation. This feast marks the moment at which the Incarnation took place. At Mary's "Fiat," God began existing in a human nature—a human nature at the earliest stages of its development within Mary's body.

"Mary's consent at the Annunciation and her motherhood stand at the very beginning of the mystery of life which Christ came to bestow on humanity." (Evangelium Vitae, 102).

At a time when our society is beset with the evil of abortion, and when the human embryo is treated as a mere object for scientific research, Priests for Life believes that the celebration of the Feast of the Annunciation is more important than ever. By celebrating this Feast with special solemnity, and by spending more time meditating on its doctrinal and spiritual lessons, the faithful can be even more solidly rooted in their pro-life convictions, and spurred on to effective action in defense of life.

CONFESSIONS: With the (blessed) growth of our parishes, confession lines have been overwhelmed. Only Fr. Jon-Paul and Fr. Henry have full-time assignments to the parishes. Fr. Brent is part-time on music and part-time assisting in the parish. Fr. Adrian's primary assignment is at Christ Hospital and the Hamilton County Jail and he helps out with Masses and other tasks as needed. So, we offer what we are able to right now. Confession times before 9:00 a.m. daily Mass at Sacred Heart and before Old St. Mary's 12:10 Mass are often not full. Saturday mornings are usually less crowded with two priests generally hearing confessions at that time. If you are able to make it to a less busy time, please do so for those who can't. Please always try to be concise, clear, and well prepared, especially when the confession line is long. If you need spiritual advice on any matter that requires more than a few minutes, please make a separate appointment—we're happy to be of service. Thank you for your consideration and cooperation so that we may make the Sacrament of Penance available to as many people as possible.



"The dear God placed me in a position in which I had a duty to call black 'black' and white 'white'."




