Each day of the week and each month, the Church has dedicated to some person or mystery of our faith. For example, the month of March is dedicated to the person of St. Joseph. Several weeks ago, and begining of the First Sunday of Lent, we began a novena to St. Joseph. We did this for the intentions of the Oratory. So please

be sure to join us in this prayer following each Mass. Some of the intentions include the stability of the Oratory, for vocations to the Oratory, the stability of the parishes, and priestly perseverance. St. Joseph is a powerful saint to pray to but is one who said so little in the Gospels.

However, his example in the Gospel is one of great strength and certainly a protective force for the Blessed Virgin and Christ. He was a source of stability for the Holy Family, especially in providing and caring for them. He is a Saint we all ought to aspire to. One who said so little and thought so little of himself. Yet had such an important and illustrious task given to him by God. He was tasked with protecting God's most loved and perfect creature, the Blessed Virgin, and God's very son. By the world's standards, he was just a simple carpenter and father with nothing to note about him. Yet, he was so beloved by God that he was tasked with the important role he had. Far more important than being a king, a pope, or even a great theologian. May we strive after St. Joseph and try to model ourselves after Him.

The Oratory originally had asked to be established on March 25, for the Annunciation. However, the Holy See chose March 19, the Feast of St. Joseph, for the establishment. We are grateful to have such a powerful intercessor and protector watching so closely over the Oratory. Be sure, in the course of the month, to ask St. Joseph to continue to bless the Oratory and protect it as he so faithfully protected the Holy Family and continues to protect the Church!

As we are now in Lent, be sure to remain strong and faithful to your penances. We must fast from the goods of the earth so that we can keep proper perspective and remind ourselves that our journey is not for the sensible delights of the world but rather to get to Heaven. We must seek to purify ourselves of our attachments and vices because God demands purity and virtue from us. There are many vices and sins, some that we often forget and overlook. So honestly, examine your conscience to find them. We can't possibly be cured if we do not know where we are sick.

Prayers for the Holy Father at Mass

In place of the Pro Pontifice prayers we have prayed at the end of Mass, we began to pray the Novena prayer to St. Joseph for the intentions of the Oratory. We will continue to do the Pro Pontifice prayer before Benediction. The Holy Father continues to be prayed for and all should pray for the Pope daily.

On Thursday, January 19, we launched an exciting new initiative to support sacred music and the arts at the parishes of the Cincinnati Oratory — **the Anerio Institute**, named for Fr. Giovanni Anerio, a priest and composer associated with St. Philip Neri's Roman Oratory. For those of you who were unable to attend our fundraiser, I wanted to share a little about the vision of the Institute, and let you know how you can help support its efforts.

First, it is such a blessing that liturgical music is such a priority at both parishes, and that both parishes make room for musical needs in their budgets. OSM has supported a professional choir for decades, and has become well-known throughout the city for many years for the quality of its sung liturgies. Sacred Heart likewise employs excellent musicians for its Masses, including Mr. Blake Callahan for the 9:00 a.m. English Mass, who heads straight from his duties at Sacred Heart to the Cathedral Basilica to play the organ there, and Mr. John Schauble, a widely-known expert on Gregorian Chant, supported by Dr. JaeEun Lee, a conservatory-trained musician of a very high caliber.

The Anerio Institute is **not** therefore begging from a place of need. Rather, in our parishes, where there is such support within the community for offering the Lord our very best musical art, we have a tremendous opportunity to establish the kinds of programs that will make a positive impact on our youth and the wider community for decades to come. In many parishes, the kind and quality of music that we are able to offer is not easily welcomed, and only comes after years in small quantities with great difficulty. Recognizing our unique position as a community to give life to this art in a way ordered towards its fundamental purpose — the worship of God and the service of the Gospel, the Institute exists to allow generous patrons who feel called to support the musical and artistic mission, for the greater glory of God, of the Oratory parishes to do so in a way that can build over time into a lasting legacy. The Institute is directly associated with and accountable to the Cincinnati Oratory, so you can be sure your gift will be handled responsibly and transparently, to support music and the arts in new and rich ways, without adding any strain to the parish budgets.


The fruits of the Institute will include offerings and opportunities beyond Sunday and feast day liturgies, including more Musical Oratories, a robust and rigorous children's chorister program, as our *Laudate Pueri Schola* continues to grow, and the ability to attract and retain skilled musicians to improve continually the quality of our programs.

Already in its short life, the Institute has been working to support the music program across the parishes served by the Oratory. Sacred Heart, supported by a grant from the Institute, has been able to hire a professional female vocalist for the choir at the 11:00 a.m. Mass, a MM student at the College Conservatory of Music, a devout Catholic eager to worship with our community, This is the kind of quality the Institute hopes to attract. The Institute is also helping *Laudate Pueri* with its web-design costs to promote and expand our children's program and make it attractive for interested students from even beyond our parish rolls.
