# Laudetur Jesus Christus! Gelobt sei Jesus Christus! Sia lodato Gesù Cristo! Praised be Jesus Christ! NOTE from the PASTOR



This month of November we remember the Church Triumphant and the Church Suffering in a particular way. The Church, as the Mystical Body of Christ, is made up of three components, namely the Church Militant (the Church on earth), the

Church Triumphant (the Church in heaven), and the Church Suffering (the Church in purgatory). We remember the latter two components of the Church, beginning with All Saints' Day on November 1 and then All Souls' Day on November 2.

In particular, we focus much of our attention on all the holy souls in purgatory, especially as we see the season change and death becomes a point of meditation for each of us. We make sure that we offer extra prayers for them, Masses, and good works. As I preach about often, every one of our actions has consequences. Our good actions have the result of gaining for us merit, which will determine how glorified we are in heaven. Our bad actions have the consequence of sin. However, even after we have sought forgiveness and God has forgiven our sins, the consequences and effects of our sins remain. If we spoke ill of someone and hurt their reputation, if we wrecked a vehicle, if we killed someone — these sins have effects that linger and justice demands that we atone for those consequences.

We do this either in this life or in the life to come. If we wait, which I don't advise, then we do so in purgatory, where all those consequences of our choices are spiritually burned from us until we are refined as gold again. This is why it is important to pray for the dead, to have Masses offered for them, and to do good works and gain indulgences for them.

In particular, on November 2, just by visiting a church and saying the Our Father and the Creed, we can gain a plenary indulgence for any specific soul we choose. Furthermore, from November 1 until November 8, by visiting a cemetery and praying for the deceased, we can also gain one indulgence per day for a specific soul of our choice. These indulgences must be applied to the dead and require us to be in a state of grace and detached from sin, that we receive Holy Communion for each indulgence, and that we make a single confession at some point within 20 days before or after the acts. We must also pray an Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be for the intentions of the Holy Father.

May we not pass up these opportunities to help those who have gone before us. May we also be sure to pray for those who have no one else to pray for them! These will be the souls who are there to welcome us into heaven when it is our time. Also, by our generosity now with the dead, hopefully those left after us will do the same for us.

And may Mary, the Queen of the Saints, be our example to grow daily in grace and virtue, so that we may be worthy of heaven!







#### All Souls

Please find the **All Souls' Book** by the statue of Our Lady comforting the souls in purgatory at Old St. Mary and by the St. Lucy statue at Sacred Heart. The names of those in the book will be remembered in our prayers through the month of November. May they rest in peace. The Church grants the

following indulgences on November 2, which may be gained for the souls of the dead:

Indulgenced Acts for the Poor Souls—A partial indulgence can be obtained by devoutly visiting a cemetery and praying for the departed, even if the prayer is only mental. One can gain a plenary indulgence visiting a cemetery each day between November 1 and November 8. These indulgences are applicable only to the souls in purgatory.

A plenary indulgence, again applicable only for the souls in purgatory, is also granted when the faithful piously visit a church or a public oratory on November 2. In visiting the church or oratory, it is required, that one Our Father and the Creed be recited. A partial indulgence, applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory, can be obtained when the Eternal Rest (Requiem aeternam) is prayed. This can be prayed all year, but especially during the month of November: *Requiem aeternam dona eis, Domine, et lux perpetua luceat eis. Requiescant in pace. Amen.* (Eternal rest grant to them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.)

# Memento morí

#### The Requiem Mass

Many notable composers have devoted a portion of their talents to setting the texts of the Requiem Mass. Choosing which to sing on a given year is always a difficulty for the Catholic choirmaster, not least because the chants themselves, unadorned, are uncommonly beautiful and don't immediately seem to require any augmentation or replacement. This year we will tread the middle way.

At the High Mass for All Souls' Day this year, the choir of Old St. Mary will be singing the Requiem Mass set by Jacobus Clemens non Papa, a Low Countries composer who lived from about 1510 to 1556. His odd name included a seemingly humorous nickname given to him by his publisher: *Jacob Clement* "*not Pope.*" This nickname has stuck with him for just about five hundred years.

While perhaps less known than other settings of the text, Clemens' is one of the best suited to liturgical use and in keeping with the spirit of the Requiem Mass. It is unaccompanied, compact, fitting in neatly to the rhythm and flow of the rites, and it is based closely on and incorporates much of the original plainchant, finding for itself a musical voice that is in perfect harmony with the simplicity and tranquility of the texts and melodies, never giving way to drama or maudlin emotionalism.

Other musical offerings at Masses for the month of November will span the centuries, and include excerpts from the more recent Requiem Masses of Fauré and Duruflé, from 19th and 20th century France, as well as motets by Renaissance composers William Byrd and Fr. Tomas Luis de Victoria, setting texts from the liturgies of All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day, and a setting of the Anima Christi by a living Italian composer.

Beyond that, we continue to strive more perfectly to realize the full Gregorian chant propers each week, a priceless heritage of music and of prayer, and the boundless font from which our heritage of sacred music flows.
